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






Police Station map of East Kolkata Wetlands






Figure 1. Year wise distribution of field inspections in different police stations in the EKW

Figure 2. Year wise distribution of cases registered in different police station in the EKW




Figure 3. Trend in cases received under RTI Act, 2005

THE EAST KOLKATA WETLANDS

The East Kolkata Wetlands (EKW) lying adjoining to the New Town, the Salt Lake along the eastern flank of the Eastern Bypass encompasses an area of 12,500 Ha. It comprises of 37 Mouzas (30 full and 7 part) under South 24 Parganas, North 24 Parganas and KMC. It has number of sewage-fed fisheries, agriculture and solid waste farms and some built-up settlement areas. The area and percentage under different land uses have been estimated as follows:

Since Kolkata is sloped towards east, it was earlier developed as a natural urban waste water treatment system, besides its utility as a carbon sink. These wetlands form part of the large stretches of lowland that is extended towards the Sundarbans. It is enormously productive with respect to fish and vegetable cultivation and supplements city's requirements to a large extent besides providing livelihood to people. Annually about 10,500 tons of fishes and about 55,000 tons of vegetables are supplied to the city markets providing livelihoods to about 50,000 people directly and as many people indirectly. The fish ponds are mostly operated by worker cooperatives, in some cases in legal associations. A variety of migratory birds also visit the wetlands during winter. The EKW has been designated as 'Wetlands of International Importance' (Ramsar site no. 1208 under World Wetland Convention) since 2002.

THE EAST KOLKATA WETLANDS MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

The East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA) has been constituted under Section 3 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 for conservation and management of the EKW.

It is guided by the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006, the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2006 and the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010 for conservation and management of the EKW.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES IN THE EKWMA

Major activities taken up during 2013-14 to 2015-16 by the EKWMA can be described as follows:-

- 1. Developmental activities
 - Monitoring of quality of sewage water for maintenance of the sewage quality and biodiversity in EKW area
 - Excavation/desiltation of bheries
 - Demarcation of the boundary of the EKW
 - Study to elucidate the significance of East Kolkata Wetland in carbon sequestration to mitigate the climate change
- 2. Field Inspection and enquiry on alleged violations of the Act and Rules pertaining to the EKW and initiating criminal cases against offenders/violators
- 3. Attending Court cases
 - Unnayan Developers Pvt. Ltd vs. State of West Bengal & Ors. (W.P.486 of 2012)
 - Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd & Anr. vs. EKWMA & Ors
 - Cases pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta and the National Green Tribunal, Eastern Bench relating to the EKW
- 4. Supplying information on the EKW to the general public as and when requested for or through RTI
- 5. Disposal of applications for NOC after due hearing

3.1 Development Activities

3.1.1 Monitoring of quality of sewage water for maintenance of the sewage quality and biodiversity in EKW area

As huge amount of fish is produced and supplied to Kolkata city regularly from the EKW utilising sewage water the main objective of this project was to highlight the average quality of sewage in main canals coming from five pumping stations and the average change in quality at inlet and outlet points of the fish bheries distributed on the both sides of the main canals.

During September, 2012 to June, 2013 water samples were collected and components such as pH, conductivity, turbidity, dissolved oxygen, BOD, COD, Total Nitrogen, Total Phosphorus, hardness, alkalinity, fecal coliform log etc. were examined for 35 number of bheries. From this study it is clear that the removal efficiency of fecal coliform and chemicals (BOD and total Nitrogen) are found comparatively more at EKW than conventional treatment technology. Considering degree of sewage rectification as assessed by National Sanitation Foundation Water Quality Index (NSF-WQI), sewage at bheri outlet is classified as good to excellent. The project was implemented through the Institute of Environmental Studies and Wetland Management.

Thus EKW plays a significant role in ameliorating the sewage water on hygienic point of view on the bheries and this sewage water is being used for irrigation of paddy fields.

¹The National Sanitation Foundation Water Quality Index (NSF-WQI) ranging from 63-100 is classified as excellent, from 50-63 as medium to good, from 38-50 as bad and less than 38 bad to very bad

3.1.2 Excavation/desiltation of bheries

During the Financial year 2013-14 EKWMA released the fund of Rs. 80,98,000/- from Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF) project to Fisheries Department, Government of West Bengal for excavation of bheries for EKWMA.

3.1.3 Demarcation of the boundary of the EKW

In view of increasing incidents of violations and consequent destruction of wetlands, there was a dire necessity for demarcation of the East Kolkata Wetlands.

As a prerequisite, various waypoints (coordinates) were selected from the satellite image using remote sensing and GIS. During 2014-15 ground truthing for verification of waypoints was started with the help of district officials of North 24 Parganas and South 24 Parganas. Virtual demarcation is almost complete whereas physical demarcation is pending.

3.1.4 Study to elucidate the significance of East Kolkata Wetland in carbon sequestration to mitigate the climate change

East Kolkata Wetlands has a potential role as carbon (C) sink for the city of Kolkata. Thus EKW performs the dual role of carbon sequestration as well as sewage purification. The study is aimed at quantifying carbon sequestration potential of the wetlands. The project is being implemented through the Institute of Environmental Studies and Wetland Management.

3.2 Field Inspection and filing of FIR

In order to enforce the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010 to stop illegal change of land use, or to stop unauthorized construction, filling up water body etc. within the East Kolkata Wetlands area field visits are conducted as and when required. Beside this, field visits are also conducted based on requirements of the EKWMA. After inspection field report is submitted to the CTO. During the time period, there were 284 field inspections. The police station-wise details of field inspection report submitted are given in Table 1. Figure 1 shows year wise distribution of field inspections in different police stations in the EKW.

Based on field inspection reports, if necessary, show cause /stop work notice directing to restore the subject plot to its original character or mode of use under section 11(1) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 is served. If required FIR is lodged with the concerned police station within whose jurisdiction the unauthorized activity is going on. Police station wise cases registered during the period of the Report are given in Table 2 and Figure 2. Mouza wise distribution of FIRs is shown in Table 3.

3.3 Court Cases

3.3.1 Unnayan Developers Pvt. Ltd vs. State of West Bengal & Ors. (W.P.486 of 2012)

During 22nd Meeting of the EKWMA on 3.2.2014 at Nabanna unanimously decided to adopt the same resolution taken during the 18th Meeting of the EKWMA on 24.2.2012 of canceling NOC for fencing relating to ecotourism projects given earlier to Bengal Sunny Rock Estates Housing Development Company Ltd., Unnayan Developers (P) Ltd., Greentech Farms & Agro Private Limited, Green Concretex Developers Pvt. Ltd., Shyam Greenfield Developers Pvt. Ltd., Sankalp Vanijya Pvt. Ltd. and Kalyan Bharati Foundation. It was observed that required quorum was present during the meeting on 3.2.2014. Accordingly a Reasoned Order for cancellation of NOC for fencing around projects sites for development of eco-tourism within the EKW was issued vide no. CTO/EN/060/161/2009-10 dated 14.2.14. Copy of the Reasoned Order is at Annexure V.

3.3.2 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd & Anr. vs. East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority & Ors.

Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. through Sri Hari Narayan Bihani, Director applied in Form-for change of character or mode of use of land in the East Kolkata Wetlands area (under Rule 8 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2006) on 24.1.2011. The purpose of application was conversion of land classification from "Shali" to "Bastu" for construction of school building and EKWMA did not issue No Objection Certificate (NOC) for the requested conversion. Subsequently Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. approached the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta in WP No.23860(W) of 2012 against EKWMA and vide Order dated 15.7.2013 the said Writ Petition was rejected.

Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. challenged the Order dated 15.7.2013 (against WP No.23860(W) of 2012) vide M.A.T 1122 of 2013 and C.A.N 7606 of 2013 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr. vs. EKWMA & Ors. and the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta passed an Order on 2.8.2013 in M.A.T.1122 of 2013 and C.A.N.7606 of 2013 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr. vs. EKWMA & Ors. with the direction to the competent authority "to consider the aforesaid prayer of the appellants strictly in accordance with law upon giving an opportunity of hearing to the authorized representative of the said appellants without any further delay but positively within a period of six weeks from the date of communication of this order".

After giving an opportunity of hearing, Chief Technical Officer issued a Reasoned Order vide No. CTO/EN/242/349/13 dated 12.9.13 in terms of Order dated 2.8.2013 passed by Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta in M.A.T.1122 of 2013 and C.A.N.7606 of 2013 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr. vs. EKWMA & Ors. Copy of the Reasoned Order is at Annexure VI.

3.3.3 Cases pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta and the National Green Tribunal, Eastern Bench relating to the EKW

The list of cases pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta and the National Green Tribunal, Eastern Bench relating to the East Kolkata Wetlands is given in Annexure VII.

3.4 Right to Information

The basic object of the Right to Information (RTI) Act, 2005 is to empower the citizens, promote transparency and accountability in the working of the Government, contain corruption, and make the democracy work for the people in real sense. It goes without saying that an informed citizen is better equipped to keep necessary vigil on the instruments of governance and make the government more accountable to the governed. Being a 'Public Authority', the EKWMA is under obligation to furnish information sought for in various RTI applications that are received.

During this period of this Report, 133 cases under RTI Act, 2005 were received and subsequently replied. Number of cases received and disposed under RTI Act, 2005 during 2013-14 to 2015-16 is at Table 4. Figure 3 gives the concerned graph showing a steep rise in the number of cases at an exponential rate.

3.5 Disposal of application for NOC to the EKWMA

During 2013-14 three members of same family (Partha Pratim Guha, wife Chhanda Guha and son Suhrid Guha) applied through post for NOC for housing in mouza Goalpota after FIRs had been lodged with P.S Sonarpur for illegal construction. CTO gave the mandated hearings and issued a Reasoned Order vide No.CTO/EN/039/373/2013-14 dated 29.1.2014 (Annexure VIII).

As per the decision of the 26th meeting of the EKWMA held on 11.02.2015, a five Member Committee headed by the Chief Secretary has been constituted to conduct hearings under Rule 8 of the EKW(C&M) Rules, 2006 for speedy and fair disposal of the applications received for change of character or mode of use of land in the EKW vide Order No. 530/EN/T-II-2/008/2005 dated 26.02.2015 (Annexure IX). The Committee has passed three 'Reasoned Order' rejecting the application for conversion of land within the EKW. All three Reasoned Orders are at annexure X.

4.1 World Wetlands Day

World Wetlands Day is observed on 2nd February every year all over the world to commemorate the signing of Ramsar Convention on Wetlands of International Importance in 1971 in the city of Ramsar (Iran). The Chairman, EKWMA welcomed the newly nominated representatives of NGOs into EKWMA. Thereafter discussion of the agenda was undertaken and following decisions were taken.

- 1) Annual accounts of EKWMA for 2012-13 prepared and audited by chartered accountants was presented before the EKWMA for approval. Office of the Accountant General (Economic & Revenue Sector Audit) had audited said accounts but requested that EKWMA approve the said accounts before the audit report is issued. EKWMA approved the said accounts.
- 2) During the past year additional audit had been conducted on the accounts of EKWMA. These were as follows:
 - i. Separate Audit Report (SAR) of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India on the Accounts of the EKWMA for the year 2011-12 (duly laid before the West Bengal Legislative Assembly on 27.7.2013) (accounts approved by EKWMA in 28.12.2012 meeting). Copy of SAR was placed before EKWMA.

- ii. Inspection Report (IR) audit conducted on the accounts of EKWMA for 1.4.2011 to 31.3.2012.
- iii. Internal Audit conducted by the Finance Department, Government of West Bengal.

EKWMA was informed by the CTO that replies have been submitted based on available records. However some serious issues have been thrown up mainly regarding utilization of funds and booking of expenditure on the grants received. In order to avoid unnecessary audit complications in future, CTO proposed that EKWMA henceforth should not directly undertake such works for which there is no in-house expertise nor engage contractors to undertake the same. EKWMA endorsed this view.

- 3) Keeping in mind the mainly regulatory function of the Authority, CTO proposed that the balance funds from the MoEF project (Rs 80,98,383) should be released to the Fisheries Department, Government of West Bengal (for excavation/ re-excavation of bheries) which was approved by EKWMA. (Action: CTO EKWMA)
- 4) Disposal of pending applications to EKWMA: 774 cases of application to EKWMA for various reasons between 2007 and 2011 are still pending unaddressed. These cannot be granted because the Wetlands Rules, 2010 prohibits construction of permanent structures within the Ramsar notified wetlands and moreover these are not in compliance with the judgment of the 1992 PUBLIC case. It was decided that these may not be considered. (Action: CTO EKWMA)
- 5) MD State Fisheries Development Corporation Limited vide letter No.Dev-605/89/pt-II/199 dated 24.4.2013 had requested permission for works of masonry culverts for the Goltala Fisheries Project being undertaken by SFDC. The concerned bheris belong to the Fisheries Department and no conversion in land use is proposed. EKWMA agreed to dispose of the case along with a copy of the joint site inspection report being made available to Smt B. Kakkar. (Action: CTO EKWMA)
- 6) Chief Engineer (Projects), West Bengal State Electricity Transmission Company Limited had requested permission for right of way through the EKW area involving installation of towers in Beonta and Tardaha Kapashati mouzas. Joint field inspection revealed that six towers would be involved, no conversion of land was proposed and none of the towers fell in waterbodies. Therefore CTO recommended the case and EKWMA approved the proposal. (Action: CTO EKWMA)
- 7) Violation cases / court cases pertaining to EKWMA: A meeting chaired by the Chief Secretary, West Bengal and Chairman, EKWMA was held on 17.5.13 between EKWMA, Home Department and the DM 24 Parganas South to discuss pending FIR/GDEs for violations of the Acts / Rules governing the EKW. It was decided to have joint inspections of complaints with the police and EKWMA staff followed by legal action. Summary of FIRs lodged police station-wise was circulated among the Members present.
- 8) Reasoned Order in terms of Order dated 2.8.2013 passed by Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta in M.A.T.1122 of 2013 and C.A.N.7606 of 2013 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr. Vs EKWMA & Ors was issued by CTO after giving a hearing. Said reasoned order issued vide No.CTO/EN/242/349/13 dated 12.9.13 was endorsed by the EKWMA.
- 9) Publication of Report of EKWMA 2006 2013: During 2013-2014 a combined Report on activities of the EKWMA since inception (2006-2013) is being published and printed through a government printing press (Silpabarta Printing Press Limited). EKWMA noted the matter.

- 10) Change of address of EKWMA office: The Department of Environment has notified the change of address of EKWMA vide Notification No.EN/2498/EKW-06/2010 dated 9.10.2013 to be at Poura Bhavan, 4th floor, Bidhannagar, Kolkata 700106. EKWMA noted the issue.
- 11) Manpower issues of EKWMA: Finance Department vide U.O No. 1778 Gr P(2) dated 27.6.2013 has agreed to creation of 22 posts subject to Cabinet approval. Cabinet note is under process. (Action: CTO EKWMA)
- 12) The case of construction of a bye-pass road in Bidhannagar South Police Station by the Nabadiganta Industrial Township Authority (NDITA) was considered and EKWMA decided to approve the proposal. CTO agreed to issue the permission letter on the same day. (Action: CTO EKWMA).
- 13) Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) management in Beonta mouza: During meeting of State Executive Committee of State Ganga River Conservation Authority of 4.4.13 examination of the Beonta site within EKW area for MSW disposal was requested since Dhapa site was almost saturated. Principal Secretary, UD on 26.12.13 forwarded the case report to EKWMA. EKWMA decided to form an expert committee with Principal Secretary, UD, Smt B Kakkar and Chairman, NDITA to examine the case and make recommendations to EKWMA for consideration. The Chairman, EKWMA welcomed the Members. Thereafter discussion of the agenda was undertaken and following decisions were taken.

1. **World Wetlands Day 2014:** The event was celebrated on 2nd February, 2014 (Sunday) jointly between PUBLIC and EKWMA. Thirty one school children, four members of PUBLIC and five staff members from EKWMA met near Bantala lockgate in the morning. Salient features of the East Kolkata Wetlands (EKW) were described to the children and everyone walked around the place. It was felt that a Wetland Interpretation Centre would have benefited the children.

EKWMA discussed the issue. It was recommended that HIDCO may further plan and develop the interpretation centre currently set up at Eco Park and Fisheries Department may plan and develop an interpretation centre at Nalban Park to better focus on EKW. EKWMA may provide financial support if required.

Smt Kakkar reported on the killings of aquatic birds around the wetlands. It was decided that Sri Ujjwal Bhattacharya, IFS, PCCF Wildlife and Chief Wildlife Warden and the Wildlife Wing of the Forest Directorate will look into the matter immediately.

(Action: ACS, Forest, Principal Secretary, UD and Principal Secretary, Fisheries)

2. Recent newspaper reports on land deals within EKW area:

Times of India on 5.1.2014 and on 9.1.2014 reported about sale of land plots within EKW area specially in mouza Hatgachha, Tardaha Kapasati, Kheyadaha, Bhagabanpur, Kulberia, Jagatipota, Karimpur, Chowbagha, etc. Matter had been referred to the DM 24 Parganas S.

The DM stated that a number of FIRs had been lodged for violation of the rules; that registration and mutation were going on and that local panchayat bodies were giving approval for the building plans. It was also reported that some realty developers had set up offices and were selling off parcels of land within EKW.

It was decided that ACS Environment will take up the issue with Land Reforms Commissioner and both DM 24 Parganas South and North for issuing necessary administrative orders to the concerned panchayat bodies. It was further decided that the matter would be referred to the DG of Police for setting up a task force with the SPs and concerned police stations for filing of charge sheet against the FIRs and expediting investigation.

(Action: ACS Environment, Land Reforms Commissioner, DM24 Parganas South /North)

3. Removal of illegal plastic, rubber and leather factories coming up on the wetlands adjoining Basanti Highway in district 24 Parganas South:

EKWMA was informed that a meeting was chaired by the Chief Secretary on 17.5.13 between EKWMA, Home Department and the then District Magistrate 24 Parganas South to discuss the issues relating to violations of the Acts / Rules governing the EKW. It had been decided during the meeting that "the illegal plastic and rubber factories coming up on the wetlands adjoining Basanti Highway should be removed".

Matter was subsequently referred to Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) by the Member Secretary West Bengal Pollution Control Board (WBPCB) along with a site visit report. Municipal Commissioner stated that the matter would be taken up along with police support after 9th February after the Book Fair.

(Action: Commissioner, KMC and MS, WBPCB)

4. Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) Management in Beonta:

Urban Development Department informed that the proposal for Beonta has been dropped for the present.

5. **Disposal of application for NOC to EKWMA:**

During 2013 three members of same family (Partha Pratim Guha, wife Chhanda Guha and son Suhrid Guha) applied through post for NOC for housing in mouza Goalpota after FIRs had been lodged with P.S Sonarpur for illegal construction. CTO gave the mandated hearings and issued a reasoned order vide No.CTO/EN/039/373/2013-14 dated 29.1.2014. EKWMA endorsed said order.

6. Violation cases / court cases pertaining to EKWMA: Unnayan Developers Pvt. Ltd vs State of West Bengal & Ors:

Environment Department and EKWMA have submitted Memorandum of Appeal, Condonation of Delay and stay Application in the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta in A.P.O.T. No. 281 of 2013 and G.A. No. 1742 of 2013. The matter is now pending.

In this context the EKWMA was informed that few years back some cases of ecotourism projects were received and granted permission for fencing though the projects themselves had not been approved. However during the 18th Meeting of the EKWMA on 24.2.2012 it was resolved to cancel the permission for fencing granted. The then CTO, EKWMA vide Order No.CTO/EN/2265/12 dated 26.3.2012 had accordingly cancelled the permission for fencing. In protest Unnayan Developers (P) Ltd. had gone to court and the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta vide order dated 21.9.2012 in W.P.486 of 2012 had ruled that Members of EKWMA neither participated in said meeting nor they took the decision, even though the requisite quorum had in fact been present.

Members of EKWMA unanimously decided to adopt the same resolution of canceling NOC for fencing relating to ecotourism projects given earlier to Bengal Sunny Rock Estates Housing Development Company Ltd., Unnayan Developers (P) Ltd., Greentech Farms & Agro Private Limited, Green Concretex Developers Pvt. Ltd., Shyam Greenfield Developers Pvt. Ltd., Sankalp Vanijya Pvt. Ltd. and Kalyan Bharati Foundation. It was further observed that required quorum was present during this meeting on 3.2.2014.

7. **Miscellaneous:** Clearance for Dhapa dumpsite for World Bank funded CBIPM project by WBPCB:

The Chairman, WBPCB explained about the proposal for remediation / containment of the Dhapa MSW dumpsite for which the approval of the EKWMA was required before bid document for the remediation work was floated. There was a requirement for installation of an Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP) for the project. EKWMA agreed in principle so that the bid document could be floated, subject to site visit by the non-official Members of EKWMA along with WBPCB officials. (Action: MS WBPCB)

The meeting ended with vote of thanks.

The Chairman, EKWMA welcomed the Members. Thereafter discussion of the agenda was undertaken and following decisions were taken.

1. Wetland Interpretation Centre (WIC):

Principal Secretary, Urban Development Department informed that HIDCO with People United for Better Living in Calcutta (PUBLIC) has already started work for development of the interpretation centre by setting apart 3 acres of land at Eco Park. For development of an interpretation centre by Fisheries Department, it was decided that Commissioner, KMC will give a copy of concept plan of interpretation centre already done by KEIP to Fisheries Department for further action and PUBLIC has assured that full cooperation shall be extended to both WIC and assist in managing the same.

(Action: Commissioner, KMC, Principal Secretary, Fisheries and Smt. B. Kakkar, PUBLIC)

2. Killings of Aquatic Birds around the Wetlands:

Sri Ujjwal Bhattacharya, IFS, PCCF Wildlife, West Bengal informed that they have identified one of the wrongdoers and a motorcycle was seized and filed a case against him. PCCF Wildlife was

asked by Chairman, EKWMA to give a report to CTO, EKWMA in this regard immediately. PCCF Wildlife assured that he will set up Awareness Boards in the vulnerable areas.

(Action: Sri U. Bhattacharya, IFS, PCCF Wildlife, West Bengal)

3. Issuance of necessary administrative orders:

Both DM 24 Parganas South and North stated that instructions issued by LRC & ACS, Land and Land Reforms Department that conversion of land cannot be done without permission of EKWMA, were informed to all concerned BL&LRO and panchayat bodies for necessary action. A copy of order may be sent to CTO, EKWMA. It was further decided that Environment Department may write to the Panchayat and Rural Development Department to issue and circulate an order that instructs its functionaries not to give approval for the building plans within EKW area as per the existing Acts/Rules.

(Action: CTO, EKWMA and Principal Secretary, Panchayat and Rural Development Department)

4. Setting up a task force for cases of violations of Rules/Act relating to EKW:

It was decided that Environment Department should personally contact again Director General of Police, West Bengal again for setting up a task force with SPs and In-Charge of the concerned police stations for filling charge sheet against the FIRs and expediting investigation within the EKW area.

(Action: CTO, EKWMA)

5. Removal of illegal plastic, rubber and leather factories coming up on the wetlands adjoining Basanti Highway in district 24 Parganas South:

Municipal Commissioner stated that Joint inspection with police is being completed and illegal factories are being identified. The process of removal of such illegal factories will commence with announcement through loudspeakers shortly. Eviction must be followed by immediate tree planting at the evicted site.

(Action: Commissioner, KMC)

6. Violation cases / court cases pertaining to EKWMA: Unnayan Developers Pvt. Ltd vs State of West Bengal & Ors:

AND WHEREAS the then CTO, EKWMA vide Order No.CTO/EN/2265/12 dated 26.3.2012 had accordingly cancelled the permission for fencing;

AND WHEREAS the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta vide order dated 21.9.2012 in W.P.486 of 2012 had ruled that Members of EKWMA neither participated in said meeting nor they took the decision, even though the requisite quorum had in fact been present;

AND WHEREAS the following 16 (sixteen) Members of EKWMA present during its 22nd meeting held on 3.2.2014 unanimously decided to adopt the same resolution of canceling NOC for fencing relating to ecotourism projects given earlier:

Reasoned Order in terms of Order dated 2.8.2013 passed by Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta in M.A.T.1122 of 2013 and C.A.N.7606 of 2013 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr.- Vs- East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority & Ors.

WHEREAS Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. through Sri Hari Narayan Bihani, Director applied in Form-I (Application No.440) for change of character or mode of use of land in the East Kolkata Wetlands area (under Rule 8 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2006) on 24.1.2011;

AND WHEREAS the plot of land under consideration was in Mouza Jagatipota, JL No.3, RS Dag No.9/61, 9/62 and 9/65, area 188 cottah under Gram Panchayat Kheadaha No.2, Police Station Sonarpur, District 24 Parganas South and as per Record of Rights (ROR) said land was classified as Shali (agricultural land) and purpose of application was conversion of land classification from "Shali" to "Bastu" for construction of school building and East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA) did not issue No Objection Certificate (NOC) for the requested conversion and the entire mouza Jagatipota falls under the jurisdiction of the EKWMA;

AND WHEREAS subsequently Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. approached the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta in WP No.23860(W) of 2012 against EKWMA and vide Order dated 15.7.2013 the said Writ Petition was rejected;

AND WHEREAS Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. challenged the Order dated 15.7.2013 (against WP No.23860(W) of 2012) vide M.A.T 1122 of 2013 and C.A.N 7606 of 2013 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr. Vs East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority & Ors.;

AND WHEREAS the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta passed an Order on 2.8.2013 in M.A.T.1122 of 2013 and C.A.N.7606 of 2013 Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr. Vs East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority & Ors. with the direction to the competent authority "to consider the aforesaid prayer of the appellants strictly in accordance with law upon giving an opportunity of hearing to the authorised representative of the said appellants without any further delay but positively within a period of six weeks from the date of communication of this order";

AND WHEREAS the Member Secretary, EKWMA instructed the Chief Technical Officer (CTO) of EKWMA to take a hearing and place the matter for decision / orders of the Chairman, EKWMA through him and accordingly a notice for hearing was issued vide No.CTO/EN/219/349/13 dated 16.8.2013;

AND WHEREAS the hearing was held as scheduled on 23.8.2013 (Friday) at 11.30am in the Conference Room at Poura Bhavan, 4th Floor and was attended by the following:

AND WHEREAS the CTO requested the Appellants to submit any documents they wished relating to the case and further requested them to check the available records in the file and the Appellants went through the records in file and stated them to be alright and photocopies of three additional *khajna* receipts were submitted and the original copy of ROR was shown by the Appellants during the hearing and Appellants were requested by the CTO to submit copy of the *Wakalatnama* and details of the school, which were duly submitted after the hearing and placed on record in the file;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Appellants as to how their proposed project involving construction of the school building would improve the local environment in the East Kolkata Wetlands and the Appellants explained about the advantages of modern and advanced teaching methods involving computers, interactive learning systems without blackboards and that for CBSE affiliation a minimum acreage of school campus was required, which was reportedly not possible in the current school compound housing classes I to IV and children had to leave after class IV and that in the new premises classes were proposed to be extended till class XII and according to the Appellants children would get the advantages of advanced learning in the new campus and would not have to leave Kolkata for better education and this would improve the environment;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Appellants as to why the new premises at Jagatipota were chosen and that the Appellants explained that all the development was happening in the area and alternative sites were too far and that the company Zee Learn Ltd. had allotted franchise of that zone to the school;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Appellants the mode in which the school was proposed to be run and that the Appellants explained that the Trust would run the school;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Appellants about the infrastructure and civic amenities available in the new premises and the Appellants explained that the area was under the Panchayats and not under the Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC), but the KMC was shortly expected to extend services to the zone and that they were going to draw ground water to meet the campus needs and that CESC was expected to provide electricity in future;

AND WHEREAS the CTO explained to the Appellants the procedure being adopted in this case, that she had been instructed to take a hearing and submit the file to the Member Secretary, EKWMA (who is also the Additional Chief Secretary, Environment) and that the matter would be thereafter placed for orders/decision of the Chairman, EKWMA (who is also the Chief Secretary, West Bengal) and the Appellants agreed.

Considering the representation submitted by the party Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. and examining the available records the CTO was of the opinion that the EKWMA may <u>not</u> grant NOC or issue an order granting sanction under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 to the Application No.440 dated 24.1.2011 from Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. due to the following reasons:

i. Perusal of the project document revealed it to be a commercially profitable venture. The following table presents selected relevant portion of the projection of performance and profitability as given in the submitted project details (Rs in lakhs):

- ii. The Deed of Conveyance has a "Schedule of the said land hereby sold". The first sentence of said schedule starts "Piece or parcel of contiguous will be used agricultural purpose agricultural land as purchased by the Vendor as per its registered deeds, documents and conveyances....". This indicates that the `Vendor purchased and subsequently sold the land classified as agricultural (shali) for agricultural purpose. The original sellers of the plots perhaps did not sell to a commercially profitable venture.
- iii. The NOC from Kheadaha No.2 Gram Panchayat for conversion from *shali* to *bastu* land has no particular relevance in the current case since as per section 22 the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006, overrides other laws.
- iv. The school proposes to run five buses, so distance does not have much relevance. Alternative sites beyond the protected Ramsar area (East Kolkata Wetlands area) can well be chosen.
- v. The East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 came into force on 16.11.2005, replacing the earlier Ordinance. The current school at Tollygunj has been functioning since 1.4.2007 on the project proponents own property. Land procurement activities for the project within the East Kolkata Wetlands area apparently were initiated from 2007-2008 after the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 came into force. Deed of Conveyance is dated 21.8.2009.
- vi. The Miscellaneous Fixed Assets in the project document lists water treatment plant, generators, transformer, electric substation, cooling tower, air conditioning, teaching aids, laboratory equipment, gymnasium equipment, five buses, etc. These are energy intensive devices. Further, the school proposes to draw ground water through tubewells to meet what seems to be its considerable water needs. The new premises housing 500 to 1000 persons are likely to generate large quantities of municipal solid waste. These cannot be said to improve the environment.
- vii. The preamble of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 (West Bengal Act VII of 2006) mentions that it is "an Act to provide for conservation and management of the East Kolkata wetlands and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto. Whereas the wetlands act as regulator of water regime, source for underground water recharging...". The project proposal does not facilitate this and therefore cannot be said to improve the environment.
- viii. As per section 10(5) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 nothing in the section empowers the EKWMA to grant sanction for change of character or mode of use of a land unless the change is for improvement of the environment.
- ix. In the 1993(1)CLJ People United for Better Living in Calcutta (PUBLIC) vs. State of W.B. decision dated 24.9.1992 (which ultimately led to the enactment of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006) it is recorded that "There shall also be an order of injunction prohibiting the respondents from granting any permission to any person whatsoever for the purpose of changing the use of the land from agricultural to residential or commercial....". The project proposal under consideration is not in compliance with said decision.

AND WHEREAS in terms of Order dated 2.8.2013 of the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, the Member Secretary, EKWMA has examined the matter elaborately and taken a decision to recommend that NOC or a sanction order under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 may <u>not</u> be granted to the petitioner Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd.;

AND WHEREAS the Chairman, EKWMA also has examined the matter and approved the decision <u>not</u> to grant NOC or a sanction order under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 to the petitioner Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. and to pass this order disposing of the matter and authorizing the Chief Technical Officer vide Rule 10(3) of East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Rules 2006 to communicate the decision to the petitioner with reasons as recorded.

Reasoned Order issued against applications made by Sri Partha Pratim Guha, Smt Chhanda Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha to East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA)

WHEREAS it had come to the notice of EKWMA that unauthorized construction was being undertaken in R.S Dag No.9 in mouza Goalpota, JL No. 13, P.S. Sonarpur, Dist 24 Parganas South without prior sanction from EKWMA and said R.S. Dag 9 is classified as "Agricultural area (full)" or *shali* in Table 19 Schedule I of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Act, 2006 and therefore subject to jurisdiction of the EKWMA;

AND WHEREAS accordingly a notice was served on 28.5.2013 and FIR lodged with Sonarpur P.S. vide No.CTO/EN/128 & 129/108(3)/13 dated 28.5.2013 and consequently the police authorities informed the owners of the concerned plots Sri Partha Pratim Guha and his son Sri Suhrid Guha about the cases lodged against them by EKWMA;

AND WHEREAS Sri Partha Pratim Guha and his son Sri Suhrid Guha then applied in format to EKWMA (received on 2.9.2013) for permission to change of use of land from *shali* to *bastu* for construction of residential building for personal use and that the concerned plots measured 7 katha (Plot No.C3) and 5 katha (Plot No.C1) respectively being in mouza Goalpota, JL No. 13, R.S. Dag 9, L.R. Khatian No.3, C.S Dag No.2, Touzi No. 147, P.S. Sonarpur;

AND WHEREAS a field inspection was conducted by staff of EKWMA on 1.10.2013 in response to the applications in presence of police personnel from Sonarpur P.S, Sri Suhrid Guha and Sri Anirban Roy representing Sri Partha Pratim Guha and that a Report was submitted vide No. 143/FLD/EKWMA/2013 dated 7.10.2013 which confirmed existence of a boundary wall, construction work within the wall and a RCC culvert made over sewerage canal for their approach road;

AND WHEREAS the Member Secretary, EKWMA approved the proposal of the Chief Technical Officer (CTO) of EKWMA to take a hearing and place the matter for decision / orders of the Chairman, EKWMA through him and accordingly a notice for hearing was issued vide No.CTO/EN/313/373/13 dated 1.11.2013 to Sri Partha Pratim Guha and vide No.CTO/EN/314/373/13 dated 1.11.2013 to Sri Suhrid Guha and that a hearing was held on 11.11.2013;

AND WHEREAS subsequently it was noticed that a 5 katha (Plot No.C2) plot in R.S. Dag 9 in mouza Goalpota, JL No. 13, P.S. Sonarpur was held by Smt Chhanda Guha who had not approached EKWMA for permission for change in use of land though illegal construction was noticed on said plot and Field Inspection Report vide No. 146/FLD/EKWMA/2013 dated 19.11.2013 was submitted by staff of EKWMA and accordingly Notice No.CTO/EN/332/108(3)/13 dated 28.11.13 was served on Smt Chhanda Guha and FIR lodged in Sonarpur P.S. vide No.CTO/EN/333/108(3)/13 dated 28.11.13 and it was noted that during the hearing on 11.11.13 neither Sri Partha Pratim Guha nor his son Sri Suhrid Guha had made any reference to the plot being held by Smt Chhanda Guha w/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha;

AND WHEREAS Smt Chhanda Guha w/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha then applied in format to EKWMA on 18.12.2013 received on 26.12.2013 for permission to change of use of land from *shali to bastu* for construction of residential building for personal use and the concerned plot measured 5 katha (Plot No.C2) being in R.S. Dag 9, Touzi No. 147, P.S. Sonarpur under Kheyadaha Gram Panchayat-I, district 24 Parganas South;

AND WHEREAS the Member Secretary, EKWMA approved the proposal of the CTO of EKWMA to take a hearing and place the matter for decision / orders of the Chairman, EKWMA through him. Accordingly a notice for hearing for 13.1.2014 was issued to Smt Chhanda Guha vide No.CTO/EN/001/373/13 dated 2.1.2014. The notice was sent by speed post on 2.1.2014 (Rt. No.EW572329364IN) and stated clearly "any failure to attend the hearing shall lead to passing of an ex parte order;

AND WHEREAS a hearing was held as scheduled on 11.11.2013 (Monday) at 11.30am in the Conference Room at Poura Bhavan, 4th Floor and was attended by the following:

AND WHEREAS Smt. Chhanda Guha did not appear for the hearing on 13.1.2014 and it was decided to issue an *ex parte* order by including her case along with the other two applicants Sri Partha Pratim Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha;

AND WHEREAS during the hearing on 11.11.2013 the CTO requested the Applicants to submit any documents they wished to relating to their applications and photocopy of a ROR (in name of Amar Kumar Malik of Tangra, P.S. Tollygunj) was shown by the Applicants during the hearing, a copy of said ROR was handed over and placed on record in the file and that the Applicants did not have ROR in their names though they claimed to have applied for mutation about a year back and that the CTO made it clear to the Applicants that without valid ROR in their own names their applications cannot be sanctioned by EKWMA;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Applicants as to how their proposal involving construction of the residential buildings would improve the local environment in the East Kolkata Wetlands and the Applicants explained about generation of employment for domestic helps / gardeners for their houses and that this would improve the environment;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Applicants as to why the new premises at Goalpota were chosen and the Applicants explained that they had heard about the available land from their business contacts in the area and that they currently resided in their flat at 181, Santoshpur East Road, Kolkata 700075;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Applicants details about the proposed land use and that the previous owners reportedly had banana orchards on the land and the Applicants explained that their houses will be built with gardens and that they had already invested in the creation of the garden and that the CTO made it clear to the Applicants that under the exiting rules regulating the East Kolkata Wetlands it might not be possible to approve permanent constructions such as made of brick and RCC;

AND WHEREAS the CTO asked the Applicants about the infrastructure and civic amenities available in the new premises and that the Applicants explained that the area was under the Kheyadaha-I Gram Panchayat and not under the Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) and that they were going to draw ground water through bore well to meet their needs and that WBSEDCL has already given electricity connection to Sri Suhrid Guha (copy of Money receipt No.5901530 & No.5901531 dated 3.5.2013 towards security deposit and house SC charge for Consumer No.Ref. 10104/563 had been furnished with the application);

AND WHEREAS the CTO explained to the Applicants the procedure being adopted in this case, that she had been instructed to take a hearing and submit the file to the Member Secretary, EKWMA (who is also the Additional Chief Secretary, Environment) and that the matter would be thereafter placed for orders/ decision of the Chairman, EKWMA (who is also the Chief Secretary, West Bengal) and the Applicants agreed.

Considering the applications submitted by Sri Partha Pratim Guha, Smt Chhanda Guha w/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha s/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha and examining the available records the CTO was of the opinion that the EKWMA may <u>not</u> grant NOC or issue an order granting sanction under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 to the concerned applications due to the following reasons:

- i. The Deeds of Conveyance dated 17.5.2012 report transfer of the land from Sri Amar Kumar Malick to Smt Kamli Jadav to Dr Sharda Fatehpuria to Partha Pratim Guha / Suhrid Guha / Chhanda Guha. The computerized ROR copy supplied by BL&LRO, Sonarpur to EKWMA vide memo No.892/BL-SNP/12 dated 24.9.2013 regarding R.S Dag 9 of mouza Goalpota does not show any of these names on record.
- ii. Moreover parts of the land in R.S Dag No.9 originally belonged to bargadars and the concerned land sales may not have followed all pertinent land rules strictly which will render mutation difficult. As already stated by the CTO without valid ROR in their own names establishing their legal right to hold the land the applications by Partha Pratim Guha /Suhrid Guha / Chhanda Guha cannot be sanctioned by EKWMA.
- iii. The Applicants have furnished copies of khajna receipts from L&LR in names of Partha Pratim Guha, Suhrid Guha and Chhanda Guha. Without mutation and issue of ROR it is not clear how such receipts have been issued.
- iv. The East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 came into force on 16.11.2005. The Deeds of Conveyance are dated 17.5.2012 long after the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010 notified by the Government of India came into force. Undertaking of civil construction without prior sanction of the EKWMA has violated provisions of the rules and regulations governing the East Kolkata Wetlands, a protected site under the Ramsar convention. *Therefore these constructions may be deemed unauthorized and illegal*.

- v. The applicants approached EKWMA for sanction of conversion of land use only after FIR had been lodged. Sri Partha Pratim Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha made no mention of the plot in the name of Smt Chhanda Guha w/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha during the hearing held on 11.11.2013. Smt Chhanda Guha did not apply for conversion of land use from *Shali* to *Bastu* along with Sri Partha Pratim Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha and did not appear for the hearing scheduled for 13.1.2014. On the whole there appears to be an attempt at hiding of facts from the EKWMA.
- vi. The new residential buildings are likely to generate solid waste (which cannot be sanitarily disposed in absence of any municipality) in addition to depleting the ground water through bore well. These cannot be said to improve the environment vis-a-vis the earlier land use as orchard / agriculture.
- vii. Under section 10(5) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 nothing in the section empowers the EKWMA to grant sanction for change of character or mode of use of land unless the change is for improvement of the environment.
- viii. In the 1993(1) CLJ People United for Better Living in Calcutta (PUBLIC) vs. State of W.B. decision dated 24.9.1992 (which ultimately led to be enactment of the East Kolkata Wetlands Conservation and Management Act, 2006) it is recorded that "There shall also be an order of injunction prohibiting the respondents from granting any permission to any person whatsoever for the purpose of changing the use of the land from agricultural to residential or commercial". The project proposals under consideration are not in compliance with said decision.

Further u/s 11(1) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 it may be ordered that the persons responsible (Sri Partha Pratim Guha, Smt Chhanda Guha w/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha s/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha) for the change in land use to restore the land, at their own expense, to the original character (orchard/agriculture after demolition of the unauthorized and illegal constructions on the plots under consideration) within the period of one month of issue of this order and, in case of default by them EKWMA may direct the District Magistrate 24 Parganas South and Member EKWMA, to undertake said restoration and recover the cost thereof as arrears of land-revenue;

AND WHEREAS the Member Secretary, EKWMA has examined the matter and taken a decision to recommend that NOC or a sanction order under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 may <u>not</u> be granted to the three applicants Sri Partha Pratim Guha, Smt Chhanda Guha w/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha s/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha who be directed to restore the land, at their own expense, to the original character (orchard/ agriculture after demolition of the unauthorized and illegal constructions on the plots under consideration) **within the period of one month of issue of this order** and, in case of default by them EKWMA may direct the District Magistrate 24 Parganas South and Member EKWMA, to undertake said restoration and recover the cost thereof as arrears of land-revenue;

AND WHEREAS the Chairman, EKWMA also has examined the matter and approved the decision <u>not</u> to grant NOC or a sanction order under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 to the three applicants Sri Partha Pratim Guha, Smt Chhanda Guha w/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha and Sri Suhrid Guha s/o Sri Partha Pratim Guha and who are directed to restore the land, at their own expense, to the original character (orchard/ agriculture after demolition of the unauthorized and illegal constructions on the plots under consideration) within the period of one month of issue of this order and, in case of default by them the District Magistrate 24 Parganas South and Member EKWMA, is directed to undertake said restoration and recover the cost thereof as arrears of land-revenue and to pass this order

disposing of the matter and authorizing the Chief Technical Officer vide Rule 10(3) of East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Rules 2006 to communicate the decision to the applicants with reasons as recorded for compliance.

Reasoned order issued against the prayer made by Vishal Water World (P) Ltd.

The Vishal Water World (P) Ltd. through Sri Kishan Sonkar, Constituted Attorney petitioned the Chief Secretary to Government of West Bengal and Chairman, East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA) vide dt. 12.8.2014; the petition was forwarded to the Environment Department for necessary action. Petitioner M/s. Vishal Water World (P) Ltd. requested for correction of record/conversion from water park, restaurants, guest house etc on the *bastoo* having an area of 17 acres at Dag no. 321/615, Mouza-Kochpukur, JL No. 2, (earlier Dag nos. 771-775, Mouza-Dhapa Manpur, JL No. 1) P.S. Kolkata Leather Complex, Dist. 24 Parganas (South). Petitioner expressed the intention to construct residential buildings on the land in question and requested to be given an opportunity of being heard.

Vide letter no. CTO/EN/065/385/2014-2015 dt. 20.3.2015 notice was issued for hearing by the Member Secretary, EKWMA. A *Vakalatnama* was already submitted authorizing Sri Pushan Kar Advocate, 7C, KS Roy road, 3 rd Floor. Kolkata -1 by the constituted Attorney for the Vishal Water World Sri Kishan Sonkar. It is placed on record in the file. The hearing was held on 02.04.2015 at the Conference Hall of the Chief Secretary (who is also the Chairman, EKWMA) at Nabanna and was attended by the following:

On behalf of the Vishal Water World (P) Ltd:

Sri. Utpal Majumdar, Advocate on behalf of the Vishal Water World(p) Ltd submitted that:

- 50 acres of land were procured jointly by three firms Vishai Water World (P) Ltd., Green Valley Towers Private Limited and Sanjeevani Projects Private Limited.
- Of the 50 acres, 17 acres of land at Dag no. 321/615, Mouza-Kochpukur, JL No. 2, P.S. Kolkata Leather Complex (KLC), Dist. 24 Parganas (South) had been recorded in the name of Vishal Water World (P) Ltd., (BL&LRO list vide 1.11.2010), while and Valley Towers Private Limited and Sanjeevani Projects Private Limited jointly hold about 31 acres of the said Dag no. 321/615.
- The Fisheries Department, Govt. of West Bengal vide its letter issued on 29.9.1997 stated that it
 was not possible to carry out pisciculture since no water existed there and the land was being
 used for paddy cultivation.

- DL&LRO, South 24 Parganas allowed the conversion of land measuring 17 acres owned by the
 petitioner from "Shali" to "water park" by its order dt. 29.5.2000 and issued no objection to use
 of the land for Restaurants, Conference hall, Towers, Water Pools, Resorts etc for commercial
 purposes on 01.6.2000.
- The order of conversion by DL&LRO, South 24-Parganas dt. 29.5.2000 was revoked vide letter dt. 27.12.2005 on the ground that the land in question falls within the East Kolkata Wetland area and is covered by the 1992 verdict passed by Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta.
- The Order dt. 27.12.2005 was challenged before the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta (vide WP No. 42 of 2006).
- The matter was then taken to the Hon. Supreme Court by the owners of the balance 31 acre of the land. The Hon. Supreme Court directed the EKWMA to consider the representation.
- The petitioner has contended that the RS Dag Nos. 771-775 of Mouza-Dhapa Manpur (presently Dag no. 321/615, Mouza-Kochpukur) are recorded as "Urban/Rural Settlement area" as per the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Ordinance, 2005, but in the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Act, 2006 it was shown as the "Substantial water body oriented area (full)" for 'no discernible reason.'

The respondent has prayed for granting of permission in favour of Vishal Water World (P) Ltd. to construct residential building in land in question based on the decision of the authority dated 23.10.2006 and the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 17.11.2006 on the ground that the Vishal water world has been discriminated against when the other two partners were granted permission to construct buildings, and has also contended that seventeen acres of area in question has already been permitted for conference hall restaurant etc. and therefore for conversion to residential construction, there should not be creation of any compensatory water body.

While considering the petition submitted by Vishal Water World (P) Ltd. as well as examining the available records the following points were considered:

- i. The RS Dag Nos. 771-775 of Mouza-Dhapa Manpur (presently Dag no. 321/615, Mouza-Kochpukur) was incorrectly shown as "Urban/Rural Settlement area" as per the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Ordinance, 2005. However, this was rectified in the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Act, 2006, as the "Substantial water body oriented area (full)".
- ii. It is worthy of note that the matter was taken to the Hon. Supreme Court not by the petitioners but by the owners of the balance 31 acres of land which by the order dt. 11.9.2006 directed the EKWMA to consider their representation.
- iii. Although, as stated by the petitioner, the order of DLLRO was challenged in the Hon . High Court, it is pertinent to note that the Hon'ble High court dismissed the W.P. and upheld the DLLRO's order.
- iv. The preamble of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 mentions that it is "an Act to provide for conservation and management of the East Kolkata wetlands and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto. Whereas the wetlands act as regulator of water regime, source for underground water recharging...". But the project does not facilitate this objective and therefore would not lead to improvement in the environment. Section 10(5) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 supports the argument.
- v. In the 1993(1)CLJ People United for Better Living in Calcutta (PUBLIC) vs. State of W.B. decision dated 24.9.1992 (which ultimately led to the enactment of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006) it is recorded that "There shall also be an order of injunction prohibiting the respondents from granting any permission to any person whatsoever for the purpose of changing the use of the land from agricultural to residential or commercial...". The project proposal under consideration is not in compliance with said directive.

- vi. For any construction on the said land, the status of the land must be altered in accordance with the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006. Although the 12th meeting of EKWMA on 14.9.2010 agreed for the construction of housing for local people on plots designated as settlements with a guideline that prohibits any construction beyond first floor to a maximum of 8m above GL, subsequently in the 17th meeting on 28.9.11 resolved to stop NOCs given for housing as well as to repeal those which were issued earlier. Presently no conversion is permitted by the Authority.
- vii. The Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010 notified by Government of India came into force on 4.12.2010. Section 4(1)(vi) of the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010 prohibits any construction of a permanent nature within the East Kolkata Wetlands, a protected site under RAMSAR convention.
- viii. The contention of the petitioner regarding the applicability of the Supreme Court Judgment dated 17.11.2006 with respect to Green Valley Towers Private Limited Vs State of West Bengal & Ors. is not tenable in the present context since the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010 notified by Government of India came into force on 4.12.2010 after 2006 which now, clearly prohibits any construction of a permanent nature within the East Kolkata Wetlands.

In view of the above the constituted Committee headed by the Chairman, EKWMA after due examination of the case decided that NOC or a sanction order under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 SHALL NOT BE GRANTED to the petitioner the Vishal Water World (P) Ltd. The decision may be communicated to the petitioner with reasons as recorded.

Reasoned Order issued against application made by Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited to the East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA)

It had come to the notice of EKWMA that an unauthorized construction of boundary wall was being erected in a part of R.S. Dag No. 657, Mouza Nonadanga, JL no. 10, P.S. Tiljola (presently under P.S. Ananadapur), Dist. 24 Parganas (South) without prior sanction from EKWMA and the said R.S. Dag 657 is classified as "substantially water body oriented area" in Table 6 Schedule I of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and therefore subject to jurisdiction of the EKWMA.

Accordingly a notice vide no CTO/EN/186/108(2)/13 dt. 18/07/2013 was served and FIR was lodged with Tiljola P.S. vide No. CTO/EN/187/108(2)/13 dt. 18/07/2013 and supplementary to the FIR vide letter no. CTO/EN/193/108(2)/13 dt. 22/07/2013 and consequently the police authorities started the case vide no. 604 dt. 24/07/13 u/s 18 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and submitted charge sheet vide no. 292/13 dt. 07/10/2013 against Debdutta Sreemany, S/O-Lt-Sambhu Nath Sreemany and Smt Mukul Sreemany, W/O. Debdutta Sreemany all of 96K, S.P.Mukherjee, Kolkata - 700026.

EKWMA received two letters from Pathfinder Study Group Pvt. Ltd on 19/07/2013 & 29/10/2014 seeking permission for change classification / conversion from *Jalabhumi* to *Bastu* at the land referred above for setting up of a school. This office vide letter no. CTO/EN/195/368/13 dt. 23/07/2013 and CTO/EN/322/368/13-14 dt. 28/11/2014 repeatedly informed them that no permanent construction or conversion of land use will be allowed on the said land as per the existing Act and Rules governing the EKW area.

Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited through Sri Debdutta Sreemany and Smt Mukul Sreemany, Directors applied in format to the EKWMA (received on 24/12/2014) for permission to change of use of land character from *jalabhumi* to *bastu* for setting up integrated residential school at the RS Dag No. 657, Mouza Nonadanga, IL no. 10, P.S. Tiliola, Dist. 24 Parganas (South).

A hearing notice was issued vide no. CTO/EN/152/346/2012-13 dt. 25/05/2015. The hearing was held on 01/06/2015 at the Conference hall of the Chief Secretary at Nabanna and was attended by the following:

Sri Sumanta Biswas, Advocate of Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited submitted that:

- The concerned plot measuring 40 cottah in mouza Nonadanga, J.L. No. 10, R.S. Dag No. 657, Khatian No. 179, P.S. Tiljola was mutated to Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited on or about 01/06/2007 with Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC). Since then, property tax has been regularly filed to the KMC.
- The said land in question was once requisitioned under the West Bengal Fisheries (Requisition & Acquisition) Act, 1965 in LA Case No. LAXX/47/66-67. However, the Fisheries Department,

- Govt. of West Bengal had subsequently relinquished possession of the said land in favour of Pathfinder Study Group by order No. 1768/ Fish/C-III/2M-60/2008 dt. 30.07.2009.
- Fisheries Department issued no objection in favour of the Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited for conversion of land from *Beel* to *Bastu* in R.S. Dag No. 657 in R.S. Khatian No. 179, measuring area 40 cottahs in mouza Nonadanga, J.L. No. 10, P.S. Tiljola for any purpose other than pisciculture thereon vide letter no. 2328/Fish/C-III/2M-60/2008 dt. 12/11/2010.
- The Competent Authority constituted under the Urban Land Ceiling and Regulation Act, 1976 mentioned that the land measuring about 2709 sq.mtr in R.S. Dag No. 657, R.S. Khatian No. 179, mouza Nonadanga, J.L. No. 10 has not come under vacant land as per section 2q of the said Act, 1976 vide order No. XVI-UL437/12 dt. 02.08.2012.

The applicants have prayed for granting permission in favour of Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited for permission of change of use of land character from *jalabhumi* to *bastu* for setting up integrated residential school for larger interest of the society.

While considering the application submitted by Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited as well as examining the available records the following points were considered:

- i. The East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 came into force on 16.11.2005. The Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules came in 2010. Construction of boundary wall was started around 2013. Construction of boundary wall without prior sanction of the EKWMA the applicant has violated the provisions of the said Act, 2006 and Rules, 2010. Therefore the construction is unauthorized and illegal.
- ii. Section 4(1)(vi) of the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010 prohibits any construction of a permanent nature within the East Kolkata Wetlands, a protected site under RAMSAR convention.
- iii. Even if no objections have been granted by Fisheries Department, and by the Competent Authority constituted under the Urban Land Ceiling and Regulation Act, 1976, the applicant cannot start construction as per section 22 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006.
- iv. The proposed G + 3 residential school building does not lead to any kind of improvement in the wetland environment. [Section 10(5) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006].
- v. The preamble of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 mentions that it is "an Act to provide for conservation and management of the East Kolkata wetlands and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto. Whereas the wetlands act as regulator of water regime, source for underground water recharging... ".The said project does not facilitate this objective.
- vi. In the 1993 (1) CLJ People United for Better Living in Calcutta (PUBLIC) vs. State of W.B. decision dated 24.9.1992 (which ultimately led to the enactment of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006) it is recorded that "There shall also be an order of injunction prohibiting the respondents from granting any permission to any person whatsoever for the purpose of changing the use of the land from agricultural to residential or commercial...". The said project is not incompliance with said directive.
- vii. In WP 23860(W) of 2012 in the matter of Splendour Commercial Pvt. Ltd. & Anr. -vs- East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority & Ors. the Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta vide its order dt. 15.7.2013 has accepted that construction of permanent nature within the wetlands is prohibited under Rule 4(1)(vi) of the wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2010.

In view of the above the constituted Committee headed by the Chairman, EKWMA after due examination of the case decided that NOC or a sanction order under section 10 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 SHALL NOT BE GRANTED to the applicants, Pathfinder Study Group Private Limited. The decision may be communicated the applicants with reasons as recorded.

ORDER

No. CTO/EN/ 209/346/2012-13

Reasoned Order issued against application made by Rupa Foundation to the East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA)

It had come to the notice of EKWMA that unauthorized construction was being undertaken in RS Dag No. 23 (Part), Mouza-Chak Kolar Khal, JL no. 1, P.S. Sonarpur, Dist. 24 Parganas (South) without prior sanction from EKWMA.

Accordingly a notice vide no.-CTO/EN/2453/108(3)/12 dt. 23.08.2012 was served by EKWMA directing the violators to stop construction work and restore the land to its original status.

EKWMA received a letter from Rupa Foundation on 12.09.2012 to develop the piece of land referred above to build a "free vocational training centre" for the local people. However, CTO, EKWMA with the consent of the Chief Secretary informed the Rupa Foundation its inability to accept any such project in the East Kolkata Wetlands vide letter No. CTO/EN/215/346/13 dt. 07.08.2013.

An FIR was lodged with P.S. Sonarpur vide No. CTO/EN/190/108(3)/2013-14 (Pt-2) dt. 14/07/2014 against the Rupa Foundation for the violation involving unauthorized construction and consequently the police authorities started the case vide no. 1106 dt. 14.07.14 u/s 18 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and submitted charge sheet vide No. 79 dt. 28.01.15 against Prallahad Rai Agarwala, S/O. Baijnath Agarwala of 12 Sunny Park PS. Ballygunj, 2) Mahabul Sk. (26), S/O. Sukh Chand Sk. of Kamurdiar, P.O. Mominpur, PS. Domkal, 3) Mostafa Sk. S/O. Lt. Akamuddin Sk. of-do-,4) Morad Sk. S/O. Rajaul Sk. of-do-, and 5) Jakir Mondal, S/O. Faijuddin of-do-.

Rupa Foundation through Sri Kunj Behari Agarwala, Trustee applied in format to the EKWMA (received on 27/01/2015) for permission to change of use of land character from agriculture to *bastu* for setting up Rupa Technical Training Institute as Vocational Training Institute measuring 30000 sft at the RS Dag No. 23, Mouza-Chak Kolar Khal, JL no. 1, P.S. Sonarpur, Dist. 24 Parganas (South).

Vide letter no. CTO/EN/150/346/2012-13 dated 22/05/2015 notice was issued for hearing by the Member Secretary, EKWMA. The hearing was held on 01/06/2015 at the Conference hall of the Chief Secretary at Nabanna and was attended by the following:

Sri Kunj Behari Agarwala, Trustee of Rupa Foundation submitted that:

- Rupa Foundation purchased a part of land at the RS Dag No. 23, Mouza-Chak Kolar Khal, JL no. 1, P.S. Sonarpur, Dist. 24 Parganas (South) in the year 2010.
- Rupa Foundation applied for conversion of land from wetland to *Bastu* on 25.11.2010.
- After getting sanction of building plan from Pradhan, Kheadah-II Gram Panchayat on 28.02.2011, construction was started.

- EKWMA *vide* no-CTO/EN/2453/108(3)/12 dt. 23.08.2012 served a notice directing to stop construction work and restore the land to its original status.
- On 12/09/2012 it was requested to allow Rupa Foundation to build a free vocational training centre at the said land.
- An FIR was lodged with P.S. Sonarpur *vide* No. CTO/EN/190/108(3)/2013-14 (Pt-2) dt. 14/07/2014 against the Rupa Foundation for the violation involving unauthorized construction.

The applicant has prayed for granting permission in favour of Rupa foundation for conversion of land character from agriculture to Bastu for setting up Vocational Training Institute in land in question as the intention is to impart training to youth and to make them employable. It will be a nonprofit making organization and will generate employment of at least 2000 drop out students every year.

While considering the application submitted by Rupa Foundation as well as examining the available records the following points were considered:

- i. The East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 came into force on 16.11.2005. The Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules came in 2010. Deeds of Conveyance were dated 08.06.2010 and unauthorized construction appears to have started around 2012. By resorting to civil construction without prior approval of the EKWMA, the applicant has violated the provisions of the said Act, 2006 and Rules, 2010.
- ii. The Deeds of Conveyance show that the said land has been sold for the purpose of Agriculture. The original sellers of the plots perhaps did not sell for any other purpose.
- iii. Even if building plan has been sanctioned by Kheadah-II Gram Panchayat, the applicant cannot start construction as per section 22 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006.
- iv. Proposed activities in the DPR do not lead to any kind of improvement in the wetland environment [Section 10(5) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006].
- v. The preamble of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 mentions that it is "an Act to provide for conservation and management of the East Kolkata Wetlands and for matters connected therewith and incidental thereto. Whereas the wetlands act as regulator of water regime, source for underground water recharging ... ".The said project does not facilitate this objective.
